

REQUIRED COURSE OF FIRE USING B-27 TARGET



Only a qualified handgun instructor may administer a handgun proficiency course.

An applicant must be able to demonstrate, at a minimum, the degree of proficiency that is required to effectively operate a handgun of .32 caliber or above, either revolver or semi-automatic handgun.

A total of 50 rounds is required for each qualification attempt.. However, you are allowed 3 attempts to pass the shooting proficiency, so up to 150 rounds could be required. Ammo must be commercially produced, no re-loads, and no ammunition from Monarch, Wolf, Mag-Tech, or CCI Blazer (Aluminum) or any other aluminum case ammunition.

- (1) Twenty rounds will be fired from three yards, as follows:
 - (A) Five rounds will be fired one shot at a time, referred to as a "One Shot Exercise" with two seconds allowed for each shot;
 - (B) Ten rounds will be fired two shots in succession, sometimes called "Double Taps", referred to as "Two Shot Exercise" with three seconds allowed for each two shot series
 - C) Five rounds will be fired in succession with ten seconds allowed for the five shots.

- (2) Twenty rounds will be fired from seven yards, fired in four five-shot strings as follows:
 - (A) Five shots will be fired in ten seconds;
 - (B) The next five shots will be fired in two stages:
 - (i) Two shots will be fired in four seconds; and
 - (ii) Three shots will be fired in six seconds.
 - (C) The next five shots will be fired in "One Shot Exercise" with three seconds allowed for each shot
 - (D) The last five shots will be fired in succession with fifteen seconds allowed to shoot five rounds.

- (3) Ten rounds will be fired from fifteen yards, fired in two five-shot strings as follows:
 - (A) Five shots will be fired in two stages:
 - (i) Two shots fired in six seconds; and
 - (ii) Three shots fired in nine seconds.
 - (B) Five shots will be fired in fifteen seconds.

A student must score at least 70% on the written examination and shooting proficiency examination to obtain a proficiency certificate. A student will have three (3) opportunities to pass the written examination and shooting proficiency examination.
